Long-term sequencing Year 7

Intent

In Year 7, we recognise and build upon, from the outset, what has been achieved by students in the primary schools. In September, students will follow the Accès Studio course, which covers the most common areas of vocabulary and introduces basic grammar principles which many will have visited in KS2. This course provides consolidation as well as catch up for those who may not have studied French. Students will then, in October, start to follow the **Dynamo** 1 course.

Today, more than ever, our students live in a multi-lingual, global society and as such, there is an expectation that they will have some knowledge of more than one language in order to become competitive in employment. Learning a foreign language at Stuart Bathurst can free our young people from insularity and provide an opening to other cultures and belief systems. An effective languages education will foster pupils' curiosity, deepen their understanding of the world and provide them with transferable language learning skills which will enable them to rise to the challenge of learning any foreign language should the opportunity occur. This curriculum will enable students to develop their linguistic knowledge across all four subject skills and develop their cultural awareness. They will make progress in phonics, vocabulary and grammar. Spoken and written language overlap, therefore, students learn listening, speaking, reading and writing together, rather than as separate skills. Our students develop valuable, life-long, transferable skills, which they will apply in everyday life.
