#### Year 10

The curriculum for this stage of students' education has been designed to learn the first topics of the GCSE course starting with the Chronological study of Britain: Health and the People C.1000 to present day. Skills for this paper will be applied during lessons. The second half of the year will be concentrating on the depth study of Elizabeth I which is both content and evaluative based. The final part of the year will be concentrated on the conflict and tension element of the study and the beginning of paper two. This topic will focus on the inter-wars years from 1918-1939 and is an explanation of how the consequences of World War One led to the events of World War Two.

# HALF TERM 1: Britain Health and the People- c1000- Present (Medicine)

#### STUDENTS MUST KNOW;

Revision of Medieval and Renaissance Medicine.

- Explore the different factors and areas of medicine
- Review the significance of individuals throughout the period.
- Go over Epidemic case studies uich as the Plague/ Black Death.

- Pasteur and the role of the individual
- Koch versus Pasteur: An evaluation on who had the most significant impact on the development of medicine.
- Epidemic Case Study: Public Health and Cholera

#### **HOW THIS WILL BE ASSESSED:**

Knowledge tests will incorporate understanding and lead to skills- based questions. Students will also be expected to evaluate sources using both provenance and content. Questions will be asked using the 8 mark and 16 mark format with 4 marks included for SPAG with the 16 marker. Source skills will also be included to explore their higher order skills.

Interpretation skills will also be included to explore their higher order skills.

#### HALF TERM 6:

- The German reaction to the Treaty of Versailles.

How will this be assessed:

Knowledge based tests will be used to explore students understanding of the inter-war years. They will have to apply their skills in order to interpret the Source questions present throughout the scheme. There will also be 4, 8 and 12 mark questions within this paper.
