Long-term sequencing Year 8

Our Year 8 curriculum builds on scriptural knowledge from Year 7 and students will apply this to all topics studied in Year 8. We aim to develop student understanding of the doctrines of the Catholic Church and how they manifest in modern day society. Through the study of science and religion, environmental issues and philosophical problems such as evil and suffering, students are able to think critically and analytically about modern day issues that pose challenges for religious believers. We aim to explore a multitude of vocations and encourage students to take part in numerous acts of charity to fulfil their own vocation. Finally, students will study an additional world faith (Sikhism) and consider what it means to be a Sikh in the modern world. We aim to build time in lessons for students to reflect on their learning and their own personal beliefs.
