Governance

Our members oversee the work of the Board of Directors to ensure that we are delivering and adhering to our Catholic mission, values and aims.

Our Directors are responsible for the strategic leadership and direction of the MAC, ensuring that it adheres to our agreed mission, values and aims as well as being accountable for driving educational standards and financial good practice. The Board meets six times a year while its two sub-committees meet once per term.

Local Governing Bodies oversee the running of the school in terms of the curriculum, safeguarding and the budget. They ensure that their school leadership team is held to account for academic performance, high quality education, quality of care and the Catholic life of the school.

Governor Focus

In November 2021, we held our first annual gathering of Governors. Current and prospective governors met to celebrate the final phase of the MAC growth strategy, and look to the year ahead.

This marked the starting point for a new culture of governance across the MAC. As the limitations of COVID began to lift, now was the time to recruit new volunteers and ensure that every school had a dedicated local board, and bring our individual boards together with our Board of Directors to provide secure, good governance.

We started the academic year with 7 schools, and 29 governors and directors forming 3 Local Governing Boards and 2 Local Education Committees. Perseverance to recruit and induct new governors, whilst retaining and strengthening existing support meant that by the end of the year, each of our Primary schools had its own Local Governing Board in place and our Secondary Schools were governed by a strong Board, specially selected for their balance of knowledge, skills and experience.

Reflecting on 2021/22

Paul is a retired Senior Local Government Manager. Having worked in a variety of Local Government settings over 25 years within both Primary and Secondary settings he was appointed Director of St John Bosco Multi Academy Company in September 2019.


FINANCE SUMMARY


2021/22 TOTAL INCOME


