Consider this...

- Would you leave your front door wide open?
- Would you want everyone to see your personal pictures?
- Would you give anyone your address?
- Are you more careful about your safety in the real world than the online world?



Did you know?

- 67% of 12-15 year olds have an active social network site profile.
- 41% of children aged 8-17 have an online profile set so that it is visible to anyone.
- 1 in 3 teenagers (12-17) have experienced some form of cyberbullying.
- 27% of teenagers (12-17) play games with people online they don't know.



Staying Safe on Facebook...

- Privacy settings are easy to put in place.
- Make sure you know who can see your posts, who can message you and also who can search for you using your email or phone number.
- You don't want just anyone seeing your posts and pictures.



Who are you talking to?

- Never arrange to meet someone in person who you've met online.
- Don't become online friends with people you don't know.
- Anyone can say they're someone else.
- Never accept friend requests from people you don't know.





Permanent Posts

- Remember, everything online is permanent.
- You may think you've deleted a post but someone, who knows how, could easily restore that post or picture.
- Think before you post anything online.
- Employers will look through your social media profiles to see if they want to hire you.



Would you want everyone to see?

- Have you posted status' or pictures online that you wouldn't want your parents to see?
- Would you be embarrassed to show your personal pictures to your family?





Rumours and Social Media

- Rumours can spread so much more quickly through social media and end up in twisted lies.
