

The U16 netball team attended the Sandwell Schools tournament on Thursday. It was a cold and wet evening but all the players demonstrated their commitment to the team and were extremely competitive for all of their matches. The team came joint second in their pool and narrowly missed out on playing in the semi finals on goal difference.

The highlight of our fixtures this week was our netball league fixtures on Tuesday night. Our U14 and U16 netball teams played away at Q3 Tipton. The girls did not disappoint right from the first whistle. Passing was fluent, footwork was on point and the shots just kept going in the net.

THE VOCABULARY GAP #1

Students will all be given an 'academic code' over the next week. The code is made up of sixty words. These words have been found to be the most frequently used words in academic situations for students aged 11-18.

The words are frequently found in exam papers, textbooks, learning resources and revision materials. The words have a similar semantic context regardless of the subject that they are found in and so the effective acquisition of the spellings, pronunciation and definition of the words will be important in assisting access to learning. What is even more important is that they understand the exact command that lies behind some of the words. For example: how is analyse different in skillset to evaluate? Whilst teachers are ensuring that students have a rich vocabulary diet this year, guidance and support from home will be crucial to building the vocabulary gap in our teenagers.

So, have a think about how often you might use any of these words at home. Challenge yourselves to embed them within your own conversations. Or simply just ask your child if they know what some of these words mean as you are out and about in the car or on the bus, or walking around the supermarket. See if they know which subjects use which words the most. We are working hard to develop a word-rich and word-curious culture this year. We want our teenagers to break the academic code so that they are well equipped for their studies, their exams and for the professional conversations that we hope they will strive to have beyond education.


