

### HEADTEACHER'S MESSAGE

Welcome to our Newsletter

Yesterday, we celebrated the Feast of Christ the King. The Gospel tells the story of some of Jesus' last moments. Crucified, dying, having been mocked and taunted, Jesus still finds it in his heart to forgive one of the criminals being crucified with him, promising him a place in his Father's Kingdom. The Gospel tells us then of a King, born many years ago.

This King was different from all others, with no palace, no crown or robes, no servants, no soldiers. This King has to wait until he is crucified to gain his crown, a crown of thorns. But this isn't just any King, this is our King, this is Jesus and he is the King of Kings, and his Kingdom is Heaven.

I was going to try to be brief this week as I feel that you have all probably heard far too much from me already but there is a bit of information I feel I need to pass onto you.

On Thursday morning, we were very pleased to host the Catholic Collaboration meeting where the Headteachers of our Catholic feeder primaries and myself meet to exchange resources and plan events. I showed the Headteachers our school line-up, student panel, and they visited classes. As always, our school was calm and the atmosphere for learning was exemplary. The student panel fielded some very challenging questions from the Headteachers and again, as I knew they would be, they were superb, selling our school through their own experiences.

Then I received word of an intruder and had to lock the school down with the visiting Headteachers locked down too! Mr Masterson, the Executive Principal of St John Bosco, wrote to me following the visit saying, "I was really impressed and the school has moved forward so much. The lockdown, although very stressful for you and your team, highlighted how effective the safeguarding culture and ethos is."

I want to thank you for your support both during and following Thursday's events. To ensure that our children felt secure and understood the events of the preceding day, we spoke to all but one of the year groups to thank them for their behaviour the day before, outline the reasons for the Lockdown Procedure, and also make sure they were clear about our expectations of their behaviour in the future.

I have to say, I have been so proud of them. Even though we were not able to tell them of our expectations prior to the lockdown, I have to say they met, if not surpassed. many of them. A standard part of any procedure in schools is regarding the use of mobile phones and so we took the opportunity during our assemblies to let them know that they should not to use their mobile phones during lockdown under any circumstances.

As a parent myself I realise that this must have been an extremely worrying time for you. I hope that our actions this week in terms of the communication with you will give you confidence that your child does not need to contact you. As parents then I need to ask you to work with us in the following ways:

We will always text you just after we have phoned the emergency services, so firstly, can I ask that you don't phone the school until you receive a text saying that lockdown has been stepped down. Calling blocks the switchboard and we may be stopping the emergency services getting through with vital information. In addition, our staff are also on lockdown and will not be answering any calls apart from those from the emergency services.

Secondly, please do not come down to the school to remove your child. Our focus needs to be on the children, settling them down and making them feel safe again. As Headteacher, I will make the decision as to whether the school needs to close early and, if this proves to be the case, we will make you aware of the situation as soon as possible.

On my part, I promise you that I will always ensure that you are kept up to date with the facts of any developments in the situation. Most importantly I promise you that I will always have the safety and wellbeing of every single member of our community at the forefront of any decisions I make.

Next week Advent begins!
As do our celebrations in the run up to Christmas. It is hard to believe that 2019 is nearly over and 2020 is about to begin. Aren't we all so very lucky to be able to be together enjoying being part of a community that keeps moving forward and faces any difficult situation as a cohesive and unified body.

#### THE FEAST OF CHRIST THE KING

In the Church's calendar, Christ the King is the parallel of the World Cup or the Super Bowl trophy. The Church's liturgical year concludes with this feast of Christ the King, instituted by Pope Pius XI in 1925 to celebrate the Jubilee Year and the 16th centenary of the Council of Nicaea.

Instituting this feast, Pope Pius XI proclaimed: "Pax Christi in regno Christi" ("The peace of Christ in the reign of Christ"). This feast was established by the Pope to reassert the sovereignty of Christ and the Church over all forms of government and to remind Christians of the fidelity and loyalty they owed to Christ.

The Feast was also a reminder to the totalitarian governments of Mussolini, Hitler and Stalin that Jesus Christ is the only Sovereign King. Christ is our spiritual King and Ruler who rules by truth and love. We declare our loyalty to him by the quality of our Christian commitment, expressed in our serving of others with sacrificial and forgiving love, and by our solidarity with the poor. In thousands of human hearts all over the world, Jesus still reigns as King.

The Cross is his throne and the Sermon on the Mount, his rule of law. His citizens need obey only one major law: "Love God with all your being, and love others as I have loved you." His love is selfless, compassionate, forgiving, and unconditional.

He is a King with a saving and liberating mission: freeing us from all types of bondage, enabling us to live peacefully and happily on earth, and promising us an inheritance in the eternal life of heaven.

Instrumental lessons are now available at Stuart Bathurst High School in partnership with SIPS Education. These lessons are now being advertised to all students. Please note that the availability for some instruments may become limited due to demand. If you wish to commit to instrument lessons, I would encourage you return the completed agreement slip, along with payment, as soon as possible. In order for lessons to be fully timetabled for January, we have set a payment deadline of Friday 29<sup>th</sup> November.

#### **INSTRUMENTS AVAILABLE:**

PIANO/KEYBOARD

DRUMKIT SINGING

STRINGS (Violin, Viola, Cello, Double Bass)

WOODWIND (Bassoon, Oboe, Clarinet, Flute, Saxophone)

BRASS (Trumpet, Cornet, Trombone, French Horn, Tuba, Euphonium)

GUITAR: (Acoustic Guitar, Electric Guitar, Bass Guitar)

When tuition ceases, instruments should be returned to the school at the final session.

#### **COST & PAYMENT:**

- Lessons are £13 per 30 min group lesson. For strings, woodwind and brass students, this includes the loan of an instrument for practice.
- Payments must be made IN ADVANCE and are NON-REFUNDABLE. They can be made for the remaining year (20 lessons) or termly (10 lessons).
- Lessons will not commence until payment is received.
- Payment must be made by cash, or cheque only (cheques payable to 'Stuart Bathurst High School').
- If the school is forced to partially close, students must check to determine if their instrumental lesson is still being held. In the event of a full closure, every effort will be made to reschedule the lesson, but there will be no refunds if this is not possible.


