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HEADTEACHER'S MESSAGE

Dear Parents/ Carers,

I love going to Mass. For us, as Catholics, Mass should be a weekly occurrence, on a Saturday evening or on Sunday. I have been to Mass in many different locations across Europe and this summer I went to Mass in St Patricks Cathedral in New York. I went to remember my mum on the anniversary of her death and was completely absorbed by the grandeur of the building itself and the beauty of the music. But most of all what I found was that God's word is the same wherever you hear it and that's because His Truth never changes and in His Truth there is comfort and peace.

This Monday marks **Holocaust Memorial Day**. Each year we stop and remember the millions killed by the Nazi regime led by Adolf Hitler. The barbarity and inhumanity endured by so many, persecuted for their faith, their sexuality, for being disabled and sometimes for refusing to tolerate the unthinkable happened just 75 years ago is, at times, beyond. So, on this day I will be reflecting and thanking God that we live in a society that allows people of all faiths to practice and celebrate their faiths openly and with joy.

This week our **OFSTED Monitoring Visit Report** was published. There are many positives in there; for example the Science department is identified for it's strong leadership and curriculum, and the Sixth Form is congratulated for being revitalised, offering our post-16 students opportunities that will enable them to . There are three questions that this visit had to answer and for us all three were affirming:

Is safeguarding effective?- **Yes**. Do the leaders and Governors of the school have the capacity to move the school forward and ensure that students get the education they are entitled to? – **Yes**. Can the school support the development of Newly Qualified Teachers? Again, **yes**.

I was particularly pleased to see that my own leadership was given the stamp of approval too. This is not because I have a massive ego but because a school without strong leadership from the top descends very quickly, failing children on its downwards trajectory. Schools with strong leadership tend to find the opposite. I have often thanked you as parents for trusting me to steer staff and students through what has been a rapid programme of improvement. The driving factor for all staff here at Stuart Bathurst has consistently been the safety and outcomes for your children. It is always good to have external scrutiny and for that scrutiny to say that what you are doing is having the right impact, is more than reassuring. Thank you again for your ongoing support.

There are also key areas for improvement identified in the report, most of which we were already working on, however change has to be prioritised and we ran out of time before the inspectors. Please be assured

that leaders are already in the process of planning and putting structures in place to ensure that those concerns mentioned are fully addressed before OFSTED returns again. Change is never easy and I would ask that no matter how frustrated you may feel, that you do not take this out on the staff of the school. We are all human and when you raise your voice or use poor language towards school staff. I ask you to remember that they too have a family to go home to, as do I. It is never acceptable to behave in an aggressive or disrespectful manner but I hasten to add that we are always ready to listen to anyone behaving in a reasonable manner.

In other news, **Year 11 and Year 13 are in mocks** so please keep them in your prayers. The predictions for the last mocks show an improvement on last years results so fingers and toes are crossed for our wonderful students success this summer. The next batch of **star badges** will be given out in the coming week as well as **headteacher's award badges**. I will give you more details of this next week.

We have sent out a text to tell you that we are **closing early on Friday 7th February**, this is to consult with staff on academisation. The following Friday we are holding a Staff Training day where we will be concentrating on SEND and various teaching techniques to ensure that all our learners have equal access to education.




